Procedure for running from the floor

Per CKI bylaws, (Article 12, Section 4) any eligible CKI member can run from the floor at convention. Interested members must meet the eligibility requirements, bring the appropriate paperwork to convention to verify their information and be nominated from the floor at the opening session. Interested members should contact Samantha Wagner (swagner@kiwanis.org) for additional information.

Eligibility Requirements (CKI Policy Code, Section G):

Must have their name appear on the official CKI membership list;

Must be in good standing with his/her home club;

Must have a home club in good standing with CKI, their home district, and their university;

Must have a home district in good standing with CKI;

Must be enrolled at the university of his/her home club, have a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale (or the equivalent) at the time of eligibility certification, and maintain a minimum cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.25 on a 4.0 scale (or the equivalent). Any special considerations may be made by the CKI Director; and, (2/17)

Must abide by their completed officer service agreement. (2/17)

Required paperwork to bring to the international convention if you plan to run from the floor (may be submitted to the international office prior to convention):

A copy of your current transcript (Spring 2023)

A copy of your fall 2023 schedule verifying that the candidate is enrolled in a college/university

I believe that fostering a connection between international committees and clubs is vital in terms of CKI membership growth at the international level, as it provides a deeper connection to the organization as a whole. Ultimately, members will join and stay if they feel valued and feel like they belong – this is what we need to focus on as an organization.

Question #4: Why do you feel like this is the best position for you?

As IVP, I will have the opportunity to do what I love on an international level: building relationships — with board members, with committee chairs, and with secretaries, treasurers, and editors, empowering the next generation of student-leaders, and passionately advocating for diversity, equity, and inclusion. As I reflected on my CKI experiences, it became clear to me that I could see myself as IVP because of my desire to give back to the organization that has given me absolutely everything. So much of me is made of what I learned from CKI. Ultimately, I have passion, goals, and a vision for the future on where I want to see our organization go, and I have the experience and drive to accomplish them.


Question #5: If you could only accomplish one thing during your term, what would you accomplish and why?

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Question #1: What have you learned from your previous experiences that you plan to implement in this role?

I have held numerous positions while in CKI, but the positions that prepare me most for this office are Club President and District Lieutenant Governor. While Club President, I was exposed to an array of experiences that have prepared me to work well under pressure and with quick turnaround time. Being Club President required me to excel in taking diverse ideas into consideration, working one-on-one with board members, and resolving conflict. As District Lieutenant Governor, I expanded upon my current skills and learned the importance of reaching out to not only my clubs but also to individual members in order to be the most effective in my efforts, whether that concerned increasing attendance at conventions or increasing participation in CKI Week.

Question #2: How do you plan to promote CKI's major service initiatives (food and housing insecurity, environmental justice, etc.) in this role?

I plan to discuss ways to commit and contribute to CKI's major service initiatives during my District Councils each semester. During these councils, I will provide district boards with service and fundraising ideas to contribute to these service initiatives. For example, I plan to discuss how I have served as the volunteer coordinator for a local food pantry for the last three years and how my home club has been able to volunteer in an environment facing food insecurity and poverty. Additionally, I plan to create a running document as a space for district boards to add their service ideas that contribute to CKI's service initiatives. I hosted these workshops last summer and at Alabama's District Convention as a Lieutenant Governor of the Alabama District with decent turnout and excellent participation. This workshop can be found on the Alabama District's website, and I believe having this workshop on International's website would benefit club boards looking to train their clubs.

My second strategy is to assist districts in the club chartering process with my experience with two new club charters. The majority of newly chartered clubs fold within the first five years, and I plan to assist my districts with their newly chartered clubs in order to prevent this.

Question #4: Why do you feel like this is the best position for you?

I have served at both club and district levels and believe it is time to bring my ideas and work ethic to the international stage. I want to continue giving back to Circle K International by leading districts and their members to success. I believe that being a District Lieutenant Governor and overseeing clubs has prepared me to be an International Trustee and oversee districts. Serving at the international level will allow me to expand my current skillset and experiences to better serve not only members but also the people in my community at home. HYPE UP!!

Through this past year serving as my District's Governor, I have seen first-hand what problems many districts are facing across the organization. The issue that I believe is the most prevalent and the one I can help with the most is engagement and district officer health, as I believe that a good engagement strategy and strong leadership is the key to retention, recruitment, and the health of our districts. As such, I introduce HYPE: Healthy Year, Persistent Engagement.

Healthy Year: A big part of my experience as a District leader was, whether we like to admit it or not, stress. I plan to make it a priority within my trustee duties to ensure that my District Governors and Surrounding Officers do not feel stressed or overwhelmed throughout the course of their terms! Here are some initiatives I'd Implement:

So, as a trustee, I plan to introduce a persistent engagement strategy with little to no cost and less time commitment on the individual member! Here are some initiatives I'd implement:

- Personalized welcome letters to each member from me welcoming them to the organization and showcasing our great qualities.
- Sistrict and District wide socials and sleepovers to allow for a low time commitment and low cost introduction to CKI outside of District Wide events.
- Sending out personalized video messages to clubs within my districts to be played in their introductory meetings.
- Holding workshops about putting spirit into CKI recruiting!

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Question #1: What have you learned from your previous experiences that you plan to implement in this role?
